INTRODUCTION*

I.

If a collection of printed catalogues of Indian manuscripts were brought together at the present time it would extend over more than 50 feet (or about 15 meter) of shelving and would constitute in itself a specialist library. We have reason to suppose that more than one million of Indian manuscripts are deposited in libraries, public or private, and that more than 600,000 different manuscripts have been listed in some manner in printed catalogues since the origins of Indian studies a century and a half ago.¹ Some have merely been listed in the simplest sense of the word, others have been described in the interests of literary history, while yet others have been catalogued according to modern techniques fully adapted to the specific character of Indian literature.

The word *modern*, however, must not be understood to mean that a final stage of manuscript description has now been generally attained. There are indeed catalogues of three generations ago that are entirely *modern* in their approach to the specific character of Indian manuscripts; and again, there are recent catalogues that have been compiled according to quite outmoded principles of description. Since there has never been a continuous development in cataloguing the manuscript collections with all the complex problems that they offer, catalogues compiled at one and the same period often present the greatest variety of individual attitudes and methods. Yet there is perhaps no other branch of Indian studies that could have developed so naturally towards a technical ideal of presentation as that of manuscript cataloguing.

The reason for the extreme variety between catalogues as in the basic assumptions of even contemporary editors can certainly be in part explained by the peculiar nature of the problem. In India, for example, the different manuscript collections could be catalogued only by means of team-work

organised by one or two principal editors or compilers. With regard to the relatively smaller European collections, on the other hand, successive scholars were frequently expected to master a collection anew, so that the end-product rarely reflected the personal transmission and continuity of technical experiences previously acquired.

So it came about that the organisers of large cataloguing projects in India were chiefly occupied with organisation or with technical matters, while the catalogues of European collections were rarely completed without frequent changes of author. This is doubtless why there are no basic works of reference in the field of Indian manuscript cataloguing. There was, for example, till now no bibliography of manuscript catalogues; there are almost no preliminary studies that could eventually be combined to form a practical handbook or a study of palaeography; or again, we lack any general compilation on dialect features that constantly appear in Indian manuscripts and reveal the regional origins of the scribes.

The inconsistencies between the earlier catalogues may further be explained from the general conditions prevailing in Europe and India at any given time and from the stage of development at which Indology stood in every case.

An impressive illustration of these conditions is provided by the different manuscript catalogues of THEODOR AUFRECHT, who was exceptional in that his whole life was devoted to the preparation of catalogues, which opened up much of the Sanskrit literature.

When the first part of his catalogue of the Bodleian's Sanskrit manuscripts appeared in 1859 — characteristically of its time still in Latin — his only predecessor to have worked to a comparable plan was ALBRECHT WEBER, whose first catalogue of Sanskrit manuscripts in Berlin was published in 1853. In both catalogues the intention was to give information about the contents of such Indian works as were available in manuscript by supplying long extracts and listing all significant details, thereby increasing as much as possible our literary and historical knowledge of the subject.

AUFRECHT had begun even then to collect title and author entries from the catalogues published in both Europe and India. After thirty years of single-handed work he produced, in 1891, the first volume of his *Catalogus Catalogorum*, containing an estimated total of 60,000 different title and author entries together with the appropriate catalogue references. His third volume appeared twelve years later.

At the end of the first volume AUFRECHT makes his bow with the words: *Augiae stabulis purgatis plaudite amici.* For with this general index to the contents of the catalogues then available to him, many of them only now acquired practical utility for the scholar, who would hitherto have had to fight his way through their lack of systematic arrangement and mutual inconsistency.

It was, perhaps, not a mere coincidence that in the years when the *Catalogus Catalogorum* appeared, the first period in the cataloguing of manuscripts in India had come to an end.

This period had begun on the 3rd November 1868 with the: "Resolution this day recorded by (Sir John Lawrence) the (Viceroy and) Governor-General in regard to the discovery and preservation of ancient Sanskrit literature."

Indian and European scholars had already been making representations to the British authorities in India, drawing their attention to the dwindling interest in the traditional transmission of the ancient literature and to the dangers arising from the neglect of the existing manuscript material. They were able to indicate collections scattered throughout the country and urged that the government should sponsor cataloguing enterprises, make funds available to buy manuscripts, expand existing central libraries and found new ones where these manuscripts might be deposited, and, finally, that important texts should be published in series.

Sanskritists both Indian and European (amongst the latter were Peter Peterson, Georg Bühler and Franz Kielhorn) could now start travelling about the sub-continent to visit the libraries of princes and private persons, reported upon their impressions and compiled lists of what appeared to them important collections and manuscripts. These official reports and lists often contained scholarly discussions on individual works and authors as well as occasional extracts from the texts. Many initial listings were made in India and as a result of constantly growing interest these were followed by catalogues which exhibited more strictly the characteristics of proper description. In subsequent undertakings, true enough, many thousands of manuscripts continued to be listed in a more or less meaningful way, but the necessity for systematic catalogues gained increasing recognition.

One might mention as an example RĀJENDRALĀLA MITRA who successfully edited several large catalogues. These works no longer maintain any distinction between "interesting" manuscripts and those apparently less so, and in every case his anonymous collaborators recorded the beginnings and endings of the texts. Although he describes predominantly private collections, only partly acquired for public institutions later, the catalogues he published are of permanent value. But, as RĀJENDRALĀLA MITRA was not too successful when providing his catalogues with the necessary indices, it remained for THEODOR AUFRECHT to compile in his Catalogus Catalogorum, the general register of Sanskrit works and authors, an effective index also to RĀJENDRALĀLA MITRA's catalogues. And AUFRECHT, for his part, derived considerable assistance in the bibliographical difficulties in preparing his Catalogus Catalogorum from RĀJENDRALĀLA MITRA's works which represent a high standard in their method of cataloguing up to the present time.

It would be surprising if Indian literature, developing and accumulating over a period of some three thousand years, had not acquired a number of characteristics particularly prominent in a bibliographical context. These may in part be an expression of the Indian mentality which, generally speaking, has paid scant regard for individual or historical distinctions. Amongst these characteristics one might mention the absence of authors' dates and the considerable

variation in their names or the form of their names — indeed, the uncertainty of authorship in general. To this could be added the multitude of anonymous titles and of independently occurring extracts from the longer works; the lack of unequivocal titles proper to each individual text and the existence of a large number of titles for a single work; further, the mass of scripts and of variants within each kind and, not least, the loose-leaf arrangement of Indian manuscripts, whereby the first and last folios, so important bibliographically, can so easily be lost. Consequently, what are termed "handlists," that is lists containing merely the names of works and of authors such as were drawn up in former times in India and, until recently, in America, can be of only the slightest value for Indian studies. Indeed they may even be quite dangerous, since catalogues, once published, are rarely revised. It was THEODOR AUFRECHT, the unrivalled bibliographer and authority in this field who took to recording the beginnings and sometimes also the endings of texts in the more elaborate and sophisticated catalogues which he published after his Bodleian masterpiece. It is often only in this way that the user of a catalogue can determine whether the stated title does in fact designate the required text.

It would perhaps be useful at this stage to give a practical example. Let us take Wordsworth's "Prelude":

Oh there is a blessing in this gentle breeze That blows from the green fields and from the clouds And from the sky; it beats against my cheek And seems half-conscious of the joy it brings.	Oh there is a blessing in this gentle breeze A visitant that while it fans my cheek Doth seem half-conscious of the joy it brings From the green fields, and from yon azure sky.

Given Indian conditions, it would be essential to quote these beginnings to distinguish between the versions of 1805 and 1850, between the stage at which the poem was without title and the version already called the "Prelude", so that the earlier version might be correctly associated with the form of words: Poem / title not yet fixed upon / by / William Wordsworth / addressed to / S. T. Coleridge, and only the last with the final title: "The Prelude". In Indian conditions, moreover, we might also expect any version or manuscript to be called "Growth of a Poet's Mind", or "An Autobiographical Poem", or "Childhood and School-Time"; and the author might appear as William and/or Wordsworth, or Cockermouth; or Son of John, or Dove Cottager, and so on. There might be a tradition of attribution to Coleridge or even, for that matter, to Spenser. Finally both the titles and the names of author might occur in association with completely unrelated texts. From the practice of quoting the beginnings and endings of each manuscript in the catalogues, another characteristic of Sanskrit literature, that has hitherto passed uncommented, can now be appreciated. Apart from the body of literature associated with texts of a regional character, i. e. belonging to local sects or schools, it may constantly be observed that both important and insignificant works (such as even poems of four stanzas) occur in identical wording and extent in Calcutta, Western India, Madras or Kashmir. From this circumstance we may assume that there was once an extremely active traffic of manuscript copies all over India.

From many other indications we may conclude that we can scarcely hope to find an autograph manuscript. Apart from a few cases where personal use was intended, all our manuscripts are copies, mostly of undefined status and indeterminable genealogy.

Occasionally it is possible to trace the passage of a text from one script into another and consequently the growth of variants originating in difference of script. But it is not only in this way one may observe the difficulties to which Indian scripts give rise. Each of them has its own peculiar difficulties, one might almost say caprices, which affect different characters in different scripts.

These difficulties are threefold: 1) signs for different sounds may be scarcely distinguishable in the same manuscript, 2) the same sign may vary greatly from manuscript to manuscript, and 3) there may be a number of phonetically distinct signs that are formally completely interchangeable. This happens, for example, in many manuscripts written in the Bengali script where: *ṇa*, *na*, *la*, or: *ba*, *ra*, *va* cannot be distinguished and the correctness of a choice between a series of indistinguishable possibilities must depend upon the wits and patience of the reader. Such is the case, for example, in: -*bāṇa*- -*bāṇa*- -*bāla*- -*rāṇa*- -*rā-na*- -*rāla*- -*vāṇa*- -*vā-na*- -*vāla*- . These difficulties are increased since the manuscripts do not separate words, constantly stray from the orthographical norm into phonetic variants and, in addition, often contain quantities of other spelling errors.

By an appropriate presentation of the beginnings and endings of each manuscript the cataloguer makes it possible to draw conclusions about the copyist's own performance. The scribe may well be distinguished by statements of his own, having a bearing upon the date of his copy and these, if exactly given in the catalogue, may reveal the extent of his linguistic attainments and his dialect origins. It was, after all, not part of a copyist's profession to have a command of the literary language or subject matter of the manuscript to be copied. Consequently, when giving the final colophons, the cataloguer should always transcribe them literally.

At the present time, however, no Indologist will rely uncritically upon the colophon of his manuscripts. It is clear that of chief importance are the form of title and the indexing; consequently the most acceptable title can be arrived at only after scrupulous collation of the existing auxiliary material, such as the necessarily incomplete Catalogus Catalogorum of the turn of the century and its sources. To these must now be added the numerous new manuscript catalogues in which, unfortunately, individual traits and superficialities abound, and which must await the herculean labours of a new AUFRECHT. For reference to available editions, however, there are the many volumes of the English catalogues of printed primary texts in the British Museum and the India Office Library collections. These contain accessions of both libraries and in particular the texts selected between 1867—1947 from the total available under the provisions of the Copyright Act.

The titles, therefore, of important, and unequivocally attributable works

can today be determined without too much difficulty. We may quote as an example the title of the "Brahmasūtra", a work ascribed to Bādarāyaṇa, which can also appear in the catalogues as "Śārirakasūtra", "Śārirakamimāṃsā-sūtra", "Uttaramimāṃsāsūtra", "Bādarāyaṇasūtra", "Vedāntasūtra", "Vyāsa-sūtra" or simply as "Brahmamimāṃsā". Sometimes it is easier to trace the variants of an author's name or of a title than the final entry fixed later by the cataloguer. For example, the manuscripts and the catalogues give for the father of Kedāra Bhaṭṭa, the author of the "Vṛttaratnākara", the following multiplicity of entries under "P" in the indexes: Pabbeka, Pabveka, Pavveka, Paṭhyeka, Prabveka, Prabbeka, Pebbekka, Pibbeka, Pabyeka, Pavyeke; or the title of a particular hymn occurs as: "Aparādhā", "Aparādhastotra", "Aparādhakṣamā", "Aparādhakṣamāstotra", "Aparādhakṣamāpanastotra", "Aparādhabhañjanastotra", "Aparādhamocanastotra", "Aparādhasundarastotra", "Aparādhadaśaka", as well as "Śivāparādhakṣamāpanastotra", "Devyāparādhakṣamāpanastotra" and "Śambho-stotra". A very different situation occurs when, in the case of anonymity or a variety of attributions, the titles of a particular work begin differently in every case. For example, in the case of "Śyāmāstotra", "Karpūrastava", "Kālisvarūpastotra", "Dakṣinākālikāstotra" we have the same text in each case. Similarly the titles "Divyamantrakavaca", "Rāmaśadaksaramantrarāja", and "Trailocyamohanavajrapañjararāma-kavaca" designate the same text.

These examples have been intentionally chosen not from the longer and well known works but from categories of shorter texts so as to stress that in cataloguing Indian manuscript material all texts require equality of treatment, irrespective of their contents and importance.

We have before us a literature that has grown to an enormous extent over several millennia, and with its lack of concern for bibliographical or historical exactness and clarity and the barely encompassable mass of its manuscript resources, everything must ultimately depend upon uniform and impartial cataloguing, i. e. upon an exact determination of title, proper subject arrangement and correct indexing.

A cataloguer of Indian manuscripts must never, therefore, completely ignore the title-entry rules applicable to a large modern library of printed books. The great difference of principle distinguishing his work is, of course, that each manuscript is an entity that resists all mechanical laws of cataloguing, and has its own existence conditioned both by the scattered manuscripts of the same text and by the literature as a whole.

In this context the cataloguing of manuscripts constitutes a basic component of the historical study of Indian literature. Indeed, the unsatisfactory status of titles and attributions of authorship is amongst the reasons that make the writing of literary history so difficult.

In these as well as in many other respects the catalogues of Indian manuscripts are of fundamental importance for the development of Indology which is still so short of critical editions (in the true sense of the word).

II

Published catalogues of Indian manuscripts owe their existence to a variety of reasons and occasions. Some are essentially no more than lists compiled for an immediate and practical end and undertaken in connection with a library (cf. 17), an exhibition (cf. 82), a private collection (cf. 229) or a sale (cf. 73). Other catalogues have primarily a more abstract and academic intention and present some specific or delimited aspect of literary history; in such cases the availability of the manuscripts themselves is a secondary consideration (cf. 6, 140, 219, 292).

Nevertheless most catalogues have this principal purpose in common, that they indicate to the scholar where any manuscript that he requires for his work may be found. It is true that, to get the necessary information, the catalogues themselves must all be systematically consulted; this task was made in many ways easier for the older catalogues by AUFRECHT's *Catalogus Catalogorum*, A Register of Sanskrit Works and Authors (cf. 6) (although both the subtitle and the preface of AUFRECHT's first volume make it abundantly plain that his chief intention was a literary-historical synopsis of titles and authors).¹

It is unfortunately true that libraries in which even a majority of the more important catalogues may be found are only too rare; where these catalogues are available, they are almost never systematically arranged on the open shelves or in the stacks. Moreover, libraries can hardly be expected to provide adequate information about catalogues they themselves do not hold.

The present bibliography has been compiled chiefly to remedy this situation. Its aim, above all practical, is reflected in the system of arrangement; the variety of cross-references was, from this point of view, thought necessary and will, it is hoped, prove useful. The references are also intended to assist the non-specialist and those operating with incomplete bibliographical information.²

This work, based on Madras, has been in progress for nearly forty years and is at present under the editorship of Prof. V. Raghavan.

Unlike its celebrated predecessor the New *Catalogus Catalogorum* incorporates a very high proportion of unpublished hand-lists representing the most varied collections scattered about India.

² It is not unknown for titles of books and periodicals to be quoted in an unhelpful, would-be elegant or downright misleading form, which obviously reduces the scholarly value of works where this occurs and moreover betrays a lack of consideration for the specialist. If the mystified reader then tries to check the inaccurate information in the libraries, he will cause himself and the already overworked staffs no little trouble. — It is unfortunate that titles of Indian manuscript catalogues quoted by scholars in their publications are not infrequently subject to these defects.

III

The present volume is the first part of an original bibliographical compilation.¹ The author has been able personally to examine in the libraries of Göttingen, Marburg, Tübingen, London (IOL, Brit. Mus., SOAS) and Oxford, with only a few exceptions (e. g. 93, 141), all the catalogues here registered. This has made it possible to give the exact titles and imprint of each catalogue and to furnish annotations concerning the type of catalogue involved and the number of manuscripts described or listed.

The first aim of this bibliography is to describe all such catalogues as have been published, whether as books, as parts of a series or as articles in journals. We include without distinction public and private collections as well as temporary exhibitions. No account is taken of whether these collections still exist or have disappeared through sale or destruction. Since a subjective principle of selection would be contrary to our purpose, we have included catalogues ranging from those containing thousands of manuscripts to such as contain very few (cf. 3), be they exemplary (cf. 176, 199) or eccentric (cf. 13, 90) in arrangement. In some cases, where a negative entry seemed desirable, catalogues with no Indian manuscripts have been recorded (cf. 69, 87). The catalogues in this bibliography cover manuscripts in nearly all the scripts and languages of India, irrespective of the nature of their contents (cf. 36, 284); although catalogues of Hindustani (Urdu) manuscripts have in the main been excluded.

The arrangement of this bibliography follows a geographical principle, i. e. main headings in alphabetical order give the names of the towns or states in which the collections are located (cf. Benares, Madras, United States). These main headings are generally followed by the names of the libraries or institutions where, according to the catalogues themselves, the collections were housed at the time they were described (cf. Benares, Government Sanskrit Library; Benares, Sanskrit College; Madras, Adyar Library; Madras, Government Oriental MSS. Library). Where more than one catalogue from the same institution occurs, the principle of priority is chronological according to the date of the publisher's or printer's imprint (cf.: 197 Madras, Government Oriental MSS. Library, 1893; 198 Madras, Government Oriental MSS. Library, 1898–99; 199 Madras, Government Oriental MSS. Library, 1901—). Items that could not be given a geographical heading are entered under their titles (cf. 299), authors (cf. 112, 330) or the names of collectors (cf. 126) etc.

Each main entry is numbered in the sequence 1–334. These numbers are also quoted in the cross-references together with the appropriate headings (cf.: Mandalay MSS.; Kielhorn, Franz). — At the end of the

bibliography follow “Unverifiable Citations” (UC. 1–36) quoted from various sources.

In the vexed matter of the form of Indian personal names we have generally preferred the solution of giving the form as actually spelt on title-pages in the English language (cf.: Seshagiri Sastri; Sharma, Har Dutt; Cāstri)¹; the same procedure has been followed for the rest of the title-page when in English. Title-pages in Indian languages have been transcribed in strict conformity with the current international system of transliteration.² The inherent *a* of the Devanāgari and other Indian scripts is moreover transcribed in cases where the modern languages would normally omit it in pronunciation (e. g. Rāma and Dāsa instead of Rām and Dās).

References will generally be found from the titles of periodicals or series (cf.: Zeitschrift der Deutschen Morgenländischen Gesellschaft; Gaekwad's Oriental Series) as well as from the names of notable owners of manuscript collections (cf.: Bhandarkar Collection; Wilson Collection). It was, however, unfortunately not possible to make the references distinguish between author, collaborator, reviser and editor. Title-pages are often imprecise or obscure in this respect.³

In addition references have been given in semi-bold type (cf. **Tüb** —) from the abbreviations and symbols (“logograms”) devised by AUFRECHT for the catalogues used in his Catalogus Catalogorum (cf. 6). These references will also be of help in using the Catalogus Catalogorum itself, for AUFRECHT, otherwise a model of scholarly reliability and bibliographical precision, did not always quote accurately the titles of the catalogues he had used. Several of his references have thus remained puzzling to this day. Moreover a number of his abbreviations were cast into a somewhat unexpressive form and were unpractically arranged in the prefaces to his Catalogus Catalogorum (cf. **Khn**, **Lgr**; **BA**, **BP**, **GB**; **Bhr**, **BL**, **Rgb**).

Thus in the case of several catalogues only the organising editor or technical supervisor is named, while those responsible for the descriptions themselves remain anonymous.

IV

The present bibliography arose out of the author's bibliographical difficulties in cataloguing. The main source of catalogue titles has been libraries in Göttingen, Marburg, Tübingen. Two journeys to England, undertaken mainly in order to use the resources of the India Office Library, were made possible by the Deutsche Forschungsgemeinschaft. Further assistance in collecting catalogue titles was provided by the libraries of the Indian Institute in Oxford, of the British Museum and of the School of Oriental and African Studies in the University of London. The second of the author's trips to England enabled him to examine a number of recent publications listed by V. Raghavan in his publication "Manuscripts, Catalogues, Editions".¹ The author is grateful to Professor Raghavan for his personal gift of a copy of this work.

Other recently published catalogues became known to the author as a result of the exhibition of books organised at the 26th Congress of Orientalists in Delhi (January 1964) and in consequence of a visit to the Chowkhamba Sanskrit Series Office in Benares.

This bibliography owes its existence in the first place to the untiring assistance of Dr. Wolfgang Voigt, General Editor of Catalogues of Oriental Manuscripts in Germany, and to the generosity of the Deutsche Forschungsgemeinschaft (the "German Research Association"). Further thanks are due to the chief librarians and their staffs in the various libraries where collections were consulted. Finally thanks must go to the publisher, Franz Steiner, and to the printer for their efforts with regard to the complicated lay-out of the present book.

The second part of this bibliography is intended to contain both corrections and additional material. Contributions and criticisms will be gratefully received by the author.
